
One place I'd love to visit (because):



One thing I'll remember about Christmas 1993 is...






P.S. The 2-week vacation was a little less pleasurable also because I got a very bad case of the flu. Grant was also very ill so we commiserated a lot.



How I feel about holidays (are there some you like more or less than others?)


