

Garrett starts as an IBM-er. They send him to Chicago for a week of


training and orientation. He thinks it would have been nice to have this a year ago when he started at IBM as a contractor. In any case, the pay raise definitely helps.

In August, we took a trip to California to visit Gentry's family. One of the things we did was go to the beach.






