





SAND CASTLE - THE ENTIRE HOUSE



Reunion Memories

June 28th the Brough family arrived to spend some time before the reunion. Kathie, Winslow, Heather, Jordan, April, Drew and Nathan all pitched in and did yard work. Winslow rototilled the garden spot and the rest of the family pulled mountains of weeds. Kathie also helped in the house. One small reward was picking and eating a few raspberries. Winslow did his best to help us understand our computer. We just wish we could remember what he says. Even the notes I take don't help much.

June 30th Garrett, Heidi, Regan and Kayleigh; Steve, Wendy, Christopher, and Ashley had arrived. The Newells had let us borrow their travel trailer to park in our yard for extra sleeping. There was lots of excitement as we ate dinner in shifts as they came and getting everyone settled for sleeping.

July 1 all 17 of us went to Sacrament meeting. It was a thrill to bear my testimony to my children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. We picked Genessa up at the airport after church and got ready for a trip to the coast. We all left for the Sand Castle and met Glenda, Grayson, Becky and Aura Leigh there. They had flown into Portland and driven to the Sand Castle. We were excited that we had such a good place to be. It was right by the beach, with fairly easy access. Lots of windows to enjoy the ocean from inside. Two huge TV's, Pool table, arcade, 4 bedrooms, 4 full baths, queen size futons, 2 kitchens with dishwasher and microwave. Plus washer and drier. Sunday, July 8, Glenda, Garry, Grayson, Becky and Aura Lee left to drive to Portland and catch their plane. Thank goodness Genessa stayed so the house wasn't completely empty. It's true everyone else was gone but the loving family spirit was still strong. How blessed we are.




